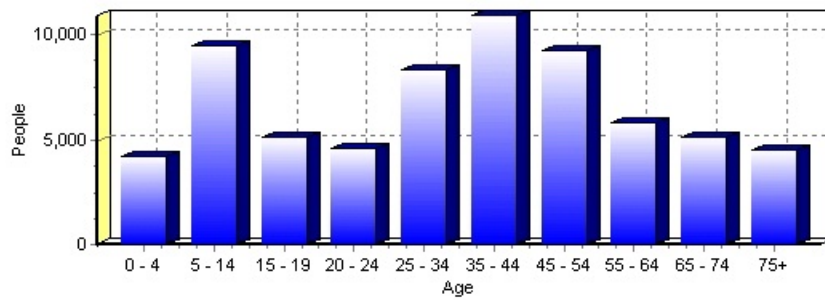

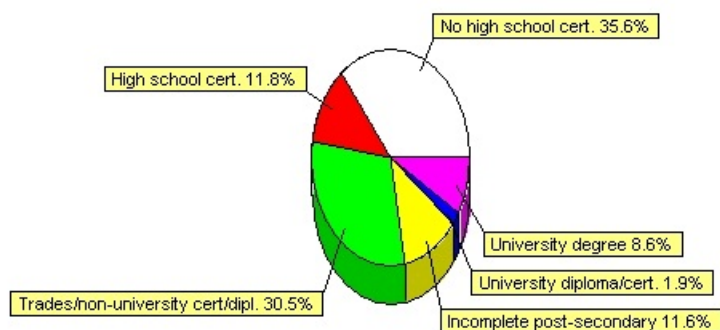

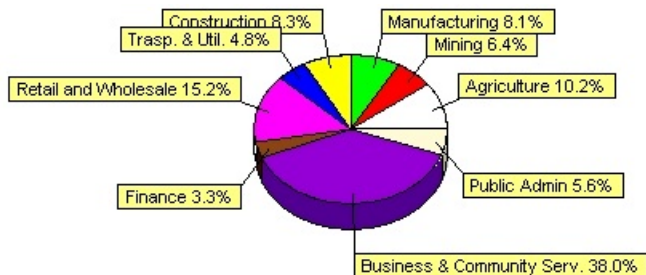

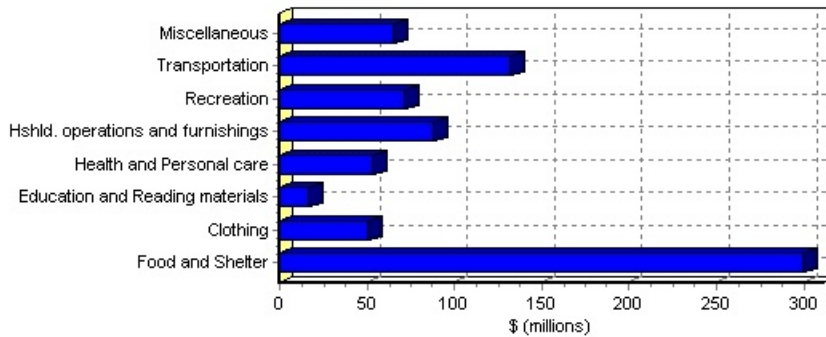

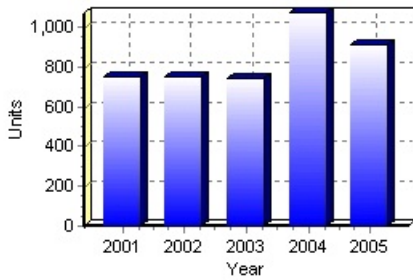

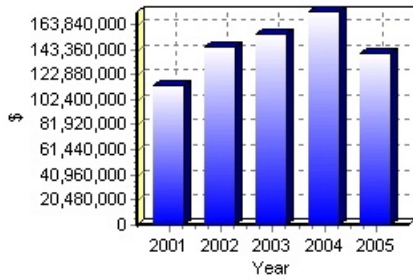

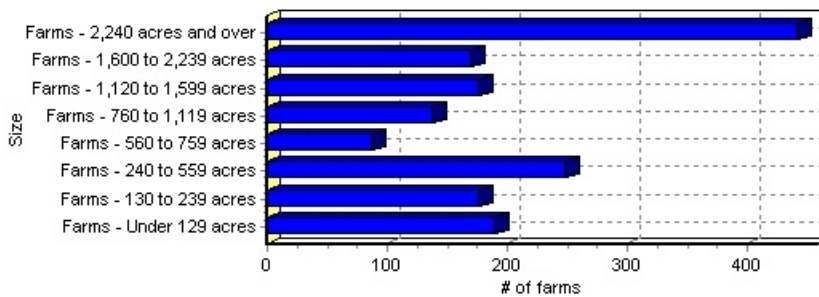

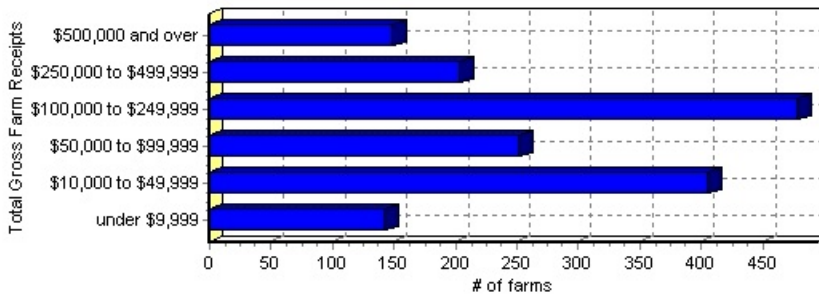
of Farms by Total Farm Area

Total Gross Farm Receipts

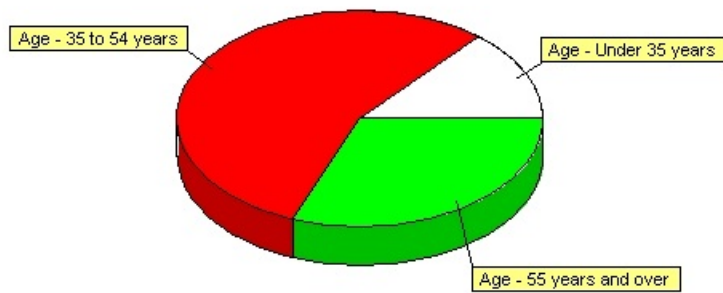

Age of Farm Operators



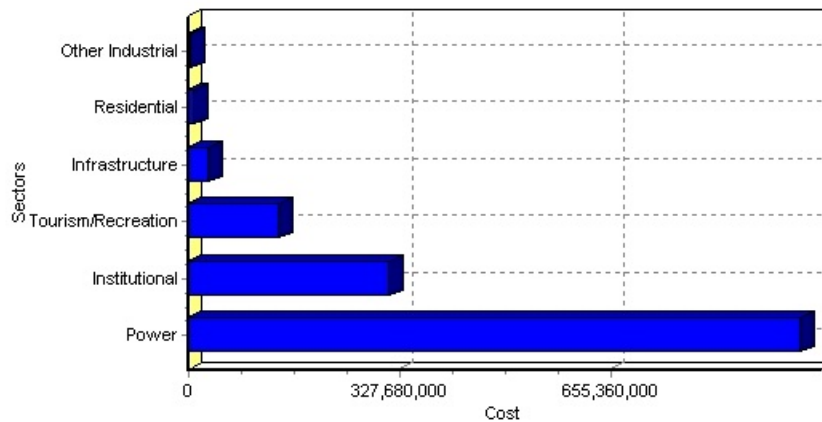
